## General Education: Common Goals – Different Paths

The three public institutions of higher education in Rhode Island each offer courses in general education for their students. Each institution has a distinctive mission, and each has the responsibility to establish and maintain its own general education program with separate course requirements. It is agreed these different paths do converge, and, therefore, many general education courses will transfer, with all three schools having the following common goals:

- ❖ Clear, correct and effective writing in English
- ❖ Persuasive speaking in English
- ❖ Engaged reading
- ❖ Critical thinking and problem-solving
- ❖ Cultural diversity and understanding human differences
- ❖ Information access and technology application
- ❖ Scientific literacy
- ❖ Quantitative reasoning and analysis
- ❖ Literary and artistic thought and expression
- ❖ Ethically and morally informed decision making
- ❖ Appreciation of global wisdom and historical perspectives

It is important to develop a plan for meeting the general education requirements. Many of the general education requirements at CCRI, RIC, or URI can be satisfied at the college you currently attend. It is a good plan to complete as many of the general education requirements before you transfer as your current school will allow. Advisors can provide advice and suggestions of courses that meet the requirements.

This section describes the general education requirements for CCRI, URI, and RIC. Please note that the general education requirements, and, in some instances, the courses that fulfill the requirements, may be specified by the college of the major. Following the descriptions of the general education programs is a list of all the general education courses and their equivalencies at the other institutions. **Use the information in this section when you discuss your educational plans and select courses with an advisor.**

## **GENERAL EDUCATION PROGRAM AT THE COMMUNITY COLLEGE OF RHODE ISLAND**

General education is the component of a Community College of Rhode Island degree program that is intended to develop a student's higher order thinking, communication and reasoning skills. These skills empower the student to explore the cultural and geographic relationships among peoples and expand a student's understanding of the natural world. General education courses contribute to the improvement, discipline and free development of the mind and spirit.

Completion of the general education component is an essential step in enabling students to satisfy CCRI's Graduate Outcomes statement. Fundamental competencies gained through the CCRI General Education program include:

- clear and correct expression in both written and spoken English
- the ability to recognize, understand and adjust to changes in life and work
- problem-solving and analytical skills
- awareness of historical, cultural and economic influences on life and work
- appreciation of the roles of the arts, humanities, science and technology

The general education component, with the professional or occupational courses required for a student's degree, form the foundation of occupational competence by increasing a student's appropriate professional skills, pride in quality performance, understanding of each individual's role and contribution within an organization, and the ability to function as a member or leader of a team in the workplace and larger community.

Students transferring to the Community College of Rhode Island must follow the specific program requirements as shown in the current catalog. Consultation with an advisor is strongly recommended. ## GENERAL EDUCATION PROGRAM AT THE UNIVERSITY OF RHODE ISLAND (URI)

At the University of Rhode Island, the General Education Program requires students to take courses in the areas of English communications (including one course in writing), mathematics and quantitative reasoning, fine arts and literature, foreign language or cross-cultural competence, letters, the natural sciences, and the social sciences. Because the specific courses approved in these areas may also fulfill prerequisite requirements for a major, students planning to transfer to the University are urged to consult URI's catalog or to discuss their plans with an advisor at URI. The following section includes a chart which lists the general education requirements approved for each college within the University of Rhode Island. Following the chart is a list of courses which have been approved for general education credit. Students in the College of Engineering and the College of Arts & Sciences should note that not all general education courses at URI are approved for their programs. The course listing denotes those courses which are not applicable to engineering and arts and sciences majors.

To use the chart, first locate the row for the college at the University of Rhode Island in which you intend to enroll; then, read the entries under each column for specific requirements within each area. For specific course listings, refer to the pages following the chart.

### UNIVERSITY COLLEGE URI GENERAL EDUCATION REQUIREMENTS BY COLLEGE

The chart below summarizes the URI general education requirements by college. Because each college has different requirements, students should consult their academic advisor and URI Catalog when selecting courses. Reference should be made to the URI general education requirements and to the requirements of individual majors.

Please note: although a course may be listed in more than one general education category, it can only be used to meet one requirement.

1. Engineering students need to be aware that there are certain courses in Fine Arts & Literature, Letters and Social Science which are not approved for their program.
2. Students enrolled in the Colleges of Nursing, Pharmacy or Environment & Life Sciences may reduce the credit requirements in Fine Arts & Literature, Foreign Language/Cross-cultural Competence or Letters by 3 credits.

## GENERAL EDUCATION PROGRAM AT RHODE ISLAND COLLEGE (RIC)

The General Education Program at Rhode Island College consists both of a core curriculum and of distribution requirements. In the core, students must take a set of four related courses which provide an understanding of cultural and historical traditions that shaped the world in which they live and a critical appreciation of values, ideas, and practices which have emerged from these traditions. Courses in the core are writing intensive with an emphasis on critical thinking. In fulfilling distribution requirements, students must take six courses which expand their knowledge by exposure to social and behavioral sciences, to visual and performing arts, and to natural sciences and mathematical systems. The ten courses required of General Education are outlined on the next page. Specific courses in some of the distribution areas may also fulfill requirements in a major, so students planning to transfer to Rhode Island College are urged to read the current catalog and discuss their coursework with an academic advisor.
